CLIMATE, TERRAIN AND NATURAL RESOURCES



TERRAIN AND CLIMATIC CONDITIONS

Ivano-Frankivsk region is located in the western part of Ukraine in the foothill and mountainous parts of the Ukrainian Carpathians. The climate is temperate continental with excessive humidity in the mountainous part and sufficient humidity in the plain part of the region, mild winters with thaws, unstable long springs, mild summers and warm autumns. A stable snow cover is formed in the mountains in winter.

The hydrographic network of the region belongs to the Dniester River basin and the Prut River sub-basin.

Ivano-Frankivsk region **ranks 3rd** in Ukraine in terms of total surface water reserves.



FOREST RESOURCES

The forest land of Ivano-Frankivsk region covers **612.2** thousand hectares, which is **46%** of its administrative area, which is significantly higher than the average for Ukraine, which is **27%**. In terms of forest area, the region ranks **8th** among the country's regions, providing **6%** of the total forest fund of Ukraine.

MINERAL RESOURCES



The total value of Ivano-Frankivsk region's subsoil is estimated at **\$99 billion** ² — according to this indicator, the region ranks **11th** among all regions of Ukraine. The largest deposits are **oil and gas, ozokerite, rock and potassium salts, sulphur, and clay.**




2 out of 3 ozokerite deposits in Ukraine are concentrated in Ivano-Frankivsk region—Starunske and Dzvyniatske. ¹

The region's ozokerite reserves amount to **78,314 tonnes**, which corresponds to **40%** of Ukraine's total deposits.

LOGISTICS INFRASTRUCTURE AND COMMUNICATIONS



AIR TRANSPORT

«Ivano-Frankivsk» International Airport is located in the south-western part, **4.4 km** from the city centre. Modernisation of the airport is a priority for improving transport accessibility in the region.



As of the beginning of 2022, the maximum capacity - **150 passengers per hour** for arrivals and **150 passengers per hour** for departures.



RAILWAY COMMUNICATION

The total length of the railways is **495.6 km**. There are **35** railway stations in the region. Density of railways ¹ – **35.5 km** per 1000 km² (average in Ukraine² – **34.2 km** per 1000 km²). Main railway junctions – **Ivano-Frankivsk, Kalush, Kolomyia**. An important area for development is the opening of a railway connection with the city of Ternopil and the electrification of the tracks.



CUSTOMS POSTS

The region is served by Ivano-Frankivsk Customs, which has **5** customs posts.

Despite the 50 km of state border with Romania, there are no operating border crossing points in the region. The opening of the Shybene-Poenile de Sub Munte border crossing would be a significant step towards the development of cross-border cooperation.



TELECOMMUNICATIONS

Ivano-Frankivsk region has stable mobile and internet coverage, including **4G** in most settlements. Digital services are being actively introduced, creating favourable conditions for business and IT sector development.











MINIMISING INVESTMENT RISKS (1/2)



SAFETY RISKS



Ivano-Frankivsk region is **located on the border** with the European Union (Romania) and is **one of the most distant from the war zone**, which significantly reduces security risks for investors and businesses



The region has developed local generation (HPPs, SPPs, small-scale renewables), and many industrial parks have their own backup power sources, which helps reduce the risk of power outages



REGULATORY RISKS



54 Administrative Services Centre, 6 Diia Centres provide access to the services needed by citizens and businesses in one place, in a comfortable and transparent environment.



Cluster associations in Ivano-Frankivsk region serve as integration platforms that bring together business, science, education and local authorities to develop innovative sectors.



Existence of business support institutions that bring together entrepreneurs and top business management, provide educational, advisory and infrastructure support (premises, technical equipment, access to laboratories or production sites), creating opportunities for company development and partnerships

MINIMISATION OF INVESTMENT RISKS (2/2)



STAFFING RISKS



A strong educational base (universities, institutes, academies, medical and technical colleges) provides **potential for development** in the IT, energy, woodworking, tourism, and oil and gas sectors.



Business cooperation with educational institutions. Industrial parks such as Kalush Industrial HUB are already implementing dual education and internships.



A high level of internal mobility of employees from other regions, as well as a positive trend of **people returning from abroad** who move to a region with a relatively stable security situation.



FINANCIAL RISKS



The Regional **Target Programme for the Development of Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises** in Ivano-Frankivsk Region for 2024-2027 is being implemented. The programme provides financial, credit and information support to entrepreneurs, including compensation of interest rates on loans and partial coverage of the costs of participation in international exhibitions.



Ukraine has established a multi-level system of investment insurance against war risks, which includes state mechanisms, international guarantee programmes and support from private insurance companies. In particular, the Ukraine Recovery and Reconstruction Guarantee Facility (URGF) was launched jointly with the EBRD and Aon, and an insurance programme is in place from the Export Credit Agency of Ukraine (ECA).



For potential investors engaged in certain types of economic activities, the government provides a number of **tax and customs incentives**, including **VAT and income tax exemptions** in cases provided for in the Tax Code, and **financial support** to industrial parks, including compensation for electricity connection costs, compensation for interest payments on loans, and compensation for investments by industrial park participants

SUCCESSFUL ENTERPRISES WITH FOREIGN INVESTMENT



Almost **200** enterprises with foreign investment (as of 31.12.2024) operate in the region, mostly in the **woodworking, machine building, construction materials, food and chemical industries**. Their activities contribute to the economic development of the region: they introduce modern technologies, increase the production of competitive products, and expand export opportunities.




